Watch and wait for Christ's coming! Light candles of hope, peace, joy, and love, remembering the promises of God with prayer.

Hear God's promise of peace from Isaiah 11:1-10: A shoot shall come out from the stump of Jesse, and a branch shall grow out of his roots. The spirit of the Lord shall rest on him, the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord. His delight shall be in the fear of the Lord. He shall not judge by what his eyes see, or decide by what his ears hear; but with righteousness he shall judge the poor, and decide with equity for the meek of the earth; he shall strike the earth with the rod of his mouth, and with the breath of his lips he shall kill the wicked. Righteousness shall be the belt around his waist, and faithfulness the belt around his loins. The wolf shall live with the lamb, the leopard shall lie down with the kid, the calf and the lion and the fatling together, and a little child shall lead them. The cow and the bear shall graze, their young shall lie down together; and the lion shall eat straw like the ox. The nursing child shall play over the hole of the asp, and the weaned child shall put its hand on the adder's den. They will not hurt or destroy on all my holy mountain; for the earth will be full of the knowledge of the Lord as the waters cover the sea.

**THE IRA CHARITABLE ROLLOVER** has been permanently extended. If you own an IRA and are 70½ years of age or older, you may transfer up to \$100,000 per year directly from your financial institution to the **First Presbyterian Church in Germantown**, free from federal tax. Benefits of an IRA charitable rollover include paying no income taxes on the transfers, using the transfer toward your required minimum distribution for the year and your gift not being subject to the 50% deduction limits on charitable gifts. To request a transfer, contact your IRA administrator. To qualify for the current year's income tax return, your request should be made in time for the check to leave the administrator's office before 12/31/17. *There is no need to wait ...do it today.*
