**THE MUSIC:** On this Fourth Sunday of Advent, we celebrate the prophecy of Isaiah fulfilled through the birth of the Christ Child in Bethlehem. In the Chancel Choir's anthem, we hear the poetry of Thomas Troeger, "Lion and Oxen Will Sleep in the Hay" from *Borrowed Light* (Oxford University Press, 1994), brought to life through the music of Glenn Rudolph. Commissioned by the Bach Choir of Pittsburg in memory of those who perished on September 11, 2001, *The Dream Isaiah Saw* is inspired by the text of Isaiah 2:1-5, calling for us to "walk in the light of the Lord." Rudolph and Troeger invite us to respond to Isaiah's dream by imploring the Christ Child, "whose bed is straw," to "take new lodgings in my heart" and "bring the dream Isaiah saw: knowledge, wisdom, worship, awe." Looking ahead, tonight: Christmas Eve Lessons and Carols service is at 7 p.m., preceded by an organ recital at 6:30. # CONGREGATIONAL MEETING

The Session has called a meeting of the congregation of the First Presbyterian Church in Germantown for the purpose of acting on the report of the Pastor Nominating Committee and the Terms of Call.

## December Session Highlights

**PNC Update:** Chairperson Contina Lundy requested the Session approve a congregational meeting for Sunday January 7, 2018. On that date, after hearing the pastor nominee preach, the congregation will be asked to approve the terms of call.

**Worship:** Reverend Bremer's last Sunday will be December 31. Until our new pastor joins us, the pulpit will be filled by Dale Williams (January 14), David Cassie (January 21), Kevin Porter (January 28) Ruth Santana Grace (February 4) and Christian Heyer-Rivera (February 11).

The Messiah Concert was a huge success with approximately 350 in attendance.

**Administration & Finance:** Health Savings Accounts, a tax advantage program, will be offered to FPCG's full time employees in 2018. There is no cost to the church for this benefit.

The Keystone State Boychoir lease agreement (through August 30, 2019) has been signed by both parties and approved by Session.

The stewardship pledge goal for 2018 is \$340,000. It appears there may be a shortage of about \$20,000.

**Communication:** Deborah Thompson reports articles for Windows are always needed and welcome. Dyhan Cassie has volunteered to update the calendar on the church website.

**Evangelism:** Ted Walkenhorst introduced our newest member, Raymond Johnson. Raymond has been a familiar face around FPCG for some time. Raymond told Session that his ministry is "helping people and keeping ourselves focused on God." Welcome!

**Christian Education:** The Christmas festival is set for Saturday, December 16<sup>th</sup>.

Fun was had by all on Friday, December 1 as we enjoyed pizza and were entertained by "The Muppet Christmas Carol."

"Animate", a seven week exploration of our faith, will begin early in the new year during the adult Sunday school time. More to come later!

**Mission & Outreach:** The *Rise Against Hunger* food packing event, scheduled for Martin Luther King Day, January 15, 2018, is in need of donations. We are short of last year's total. See Gloria Bethea or Chris Scott to contribute and find out more about this great opportunity to help the world's hungry.

**Congregational Development:** The Christmas dinner was a big hit. 130 tickets were sold.
