
Great Prayer of Thanksgiving

THE MUSIC: On this Epiphany Sunday, we celebrate the arrival of the Magi bearing gifts for the Christ Child of Bethlehem. The poetry of this carol is filled with vivid imagery, which is captured in the reflective and dramatic arrangement by Larry Visser. The carol text was written by Christina Rossetti and set to music by Gustav Holst (probably best known for *The Planets*) more than a century ago.
