CONVERSATIONS ABOUT RACE, a monthly event sponsored by the Presbytery of Philadelphia and the *Coming to the Table* organization (CTT), will begin at FPCG on Saturday, May 19. The group will meet on the third Saturday of the month from 9:30 a.m. to noon.

CTT is a nation-wide organization dedicated to acknowledging and healing the wounds of racism by creating a safe space for participants to deepen their understanding of racism, strengthen community and take action. Discussions will be led by CTT-trained facilitators and are **free of charge**. Pre-registration is not necessary—you can register at the event.


