WELCOME: If you are visiting with us today, please sign the Fellowship Pad at the end of your pew. We pray the hour will be meaningful to you and you will come and worship with us again. Everyone is cordially invited to a time of fellowship in the Longstreth Auditorium following the worship service.

THE MUSIC: René Clausen, whose anthem is heard in the offertory today, is an internationally renowned choral conductor and composer with more than one hundred commissioned works to his credit. Clausen's stirring setting of a text from Song of Solomon was composed the night his wife lost a child during pregnancy resulting from a failed medical procedure. That tragic loss followed a history of three consecutive heartbreaking miscarriages. In the middle section of the anthem, "Many waters cannot quench love," Clausen's music washes over the listener as waves of healing sound. The anthem closes just as it began, reminding us that love is stronger than death, that God's love endures forever. Looking ahead: The Children's Choir will sing in worship next Sunday (May 13, Mother's Day); Voices in Bronze will play again on May 20; the Chancel Choir will sing through May 27; the Gospel Choir will sing again on June 3, then all choirs will take a break until September. CONVERSATIONS ABOUT RACE, a monthly event sponsored by the Presbytery of Philadelphia and the *Coming to the Table* organization (CTT), will begin at FPCG on Saturday, May 19. The group will meet on the third Saturday of the month from 9:30 a.m. to noon.

CTT is a nation-wide organization dedicated to acknowledging and healing the wounds of racism by creating a safe space for participants to deepen their understanding of racism, strengthen community and take action. Discussions will be led by CTT-trained facilitators and are **free of charge**.

FIRST CHURCH PUERTO RICO MISSION TRIP

July 21-28, 2018

Nearly six months after Hurricane Maria devastated the beautiful *Isla del Encanto*, many in Puerto Rico remain without power as they work to rebuild their lives and communities. This July, Christian, Sheila, Emanuel and Elisa Heyer-Rivera; Andrea and Josh Overton; Jason, Rosemary, Sienna and Sol Williams; Sara and Jasmine Greene; Marc DiNardo; Annie Kotto and her daughter Danielle Ohemeng, and Leah and Emery Hood will work at the **Presbyterian Disaster Assistance** site located at the **Añasco Presbyterian Church** on the western coast of the island.

Several fundraising events are being held to support this trip: an ongoing **Mother's Day Plant Sale** (plants to be distributed May 12 and 13); a **Piña Colada Sale** on Saturday, June 10 and a **Puerto Rico Evening Out** on Saturday, June 30. Our goal is to raise \$10,000 (\$500 per person) to help offset the cost of our trip as well as supplies and food for the Añasco Presbyterian Church.

Our team is blessed with multiple gifts: three of our participants are medical professionals and will host a health clinic, several of our members will use their electrical and construction expertise to help rebuild, those of us who speak Spanish will act as translators and others will help to clean, paint and remove debris.

There is much work to be done!
