THE MUSIC: We are blessed to have Daniel Conner and Matthew Reisse offering their talents in worship today. The saxophone is in the family of wind instruments and most commonly associated with concert band, wind ensemble, and jazz repertoire. Since it was first introduced by Adolphe Sax in the middle of the nineteenth century, the instrument has received nine permutations ranging from Sopranissimo (the highest pitched) to Subcontrabass (the lowest pitched). We will hear the soprano and alto saxophones played in worship today.

Lessons this week were on making a difference in the world. They read the following books: *The Day GoGo* Voted by Elinor Sisulu, *Whoever You Are* by Mem Fox, *Talking About Bessie* by Nikki Grimes, and *The Absolutely True Diary of a Part-Time Indian* by Sherman Alexie. On Friday, the scholars went to iFly Indoor Skydiving and had a STEM workshop. They also had their own personal flights. It was a fun time by scholars and staff

alike. This week our guests from The Philadelphia Project were from Narbeth Presbyterian Church (EPC). The scholars and their family will be joining us for worship next week.

REV REBECCA SEGERS is still in Puerto Rico. She served with fellow FPCG participants in service in Añasco through July 21 and is now participating in the PCUSA Fossil Free Delegation through July 31. She will not be at Uncle Bobbie's on Thursday mornings until August. First Church's ministry in Puerto Rico will be the focus of worship on Sunday, September 22nd.

JULY CHALLENGE OFFERING SUNDAY BREAKFAST RESCUE MISSION: Founded in 1878, Sunday Breakfast Rescue Mission, have reached out to the homeless in Philadelphia for more than 130 years. Originally named the Sunday Breakfast Association, their name was changed a few years ago to reflect their expanded services as a Rescue Mission. Rescue Missions are similar to a traditional homeless shelter, but focus on caring for the spiritual needs in addition to the practical needs of people. Sunday Breakfast Rescue Mission, a non-profit organization, exists to minister in the name of Jesus Christ to the physical and spiritual needs of homeless and disadvantaged people in the Philadelphia area. Sunday Breakfast Rescue Mission aims to transform lives by the power of God; so that those who have been loved, rescued and trained would become those who love, rescue and train. Sunday Breakfast Rescue Mission serves the homeless through two locations in Philadelphia: a meal service program serving three meals a day to anyone in need and men's shelter in Center City and a transitional home for women in the Germantown neighborhood of Philadelphia. The Center City shelter also houses a long-term recovery program for men. The Mission does not receive government funding and relies on the generous contributions of caring individuals, families, churches and businesses.

COMMUNITY INFORMATION SESSION: Come out on August 8, 6-8pm, and learn how to use the new voting machines for Philadelphia elections. This information session will be hosted at FPCG by State Representative Stephen Kinsey. Representatives from the Philadelphia City Commissioner's office will demonstrate how the new machines operate.
