**THE MUSIC:** The Brahms *Requiem* (1868) stands among the greatest monuments of choral repertoire, and includes the beloved setting of Ps. 84, "How Lovely Is Thy Dwelling Place." Today's offertory is accompanied on the Linda Leube Memorial Concert Piano using the composer's own arrangement for piano four hands. The Brahms *Requiem* is set apart

from other Requiems by the use of text from the Lutheran Bible rather than the Latin mass text. The composer's stated intention was to create a musical work to comfort the living rather than one for the souls of the dead. In this work, Brahms focused on faith in the Resurrection rather than on fear of the Last Judgment.

On Nov. 17 at 4 p.m., the 1927 academy award winning *Wings*, a WWI silent movie, will be screened with improvised organ accompaniment by Peter Krasinski. Both events are free and open to the public through generous contributions from members and friends of First Church. Additional support is provided by the American Guild of Organists and the Pennsylvania Council on the Arts, a state agency funded by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and the National Endowment for the Arts, a federal agency.

**ACT & ENGAGE:** Act & Engage is a new initiative that offers the opportunity to wrestle with important issues as followers of Christ: to listen, to learn, to engage through the lens of our Christian faith. Our first topic is Criminal Justice. Join us Sunday, November 17<sup>th</sup> or Tuesday November 19<sup>th</sup> when we discuss “Just Mercy” by Bryan Stevenson. Critics say “The book provides readers a window into the justice system... The stories told within... hold the potential to transform what we think we mean when we talk about justice.” Books are \$8 and available for purchase during coffee hour. Following this introduction, two additional Act and Engage events on Criminal Justice will more narrowly focus on Veterans, specifically, those involved in the justice system and dealing with PTSD and other mental health issues.
