Reader 1: Our time to wait\* is over. Christmas is here. Our days of preparation\* are completed. What has not been done will now have to be left undone. We have witnessed\* to this very hour, this very night, and we hope that the world has heard the good news which we have spoken. We have decided on “acceptance,”\* of doing things God’s way rather than our own, and to be satisfied with God’s will.

Reader 2: Listen to the words from the prophet Isaiah: *“How beautiful upon the mountains are the feet of the messenger who announces peace, who brings good news, who announces salvation, who says to Zion, “Your God reigns.” Listen! Your sentinels lift up their voices, together they sing for joy; for in plain sight they see the return of the LORD to Zion. Break forth together into singing, you ruins of Jerusalem. The LORD has bared his holy arm before the eyes of all the nations; and all the ends of the earth shall see the salvation of our God.”*

Reader 3: Our circle of Advent candles is lit; now tonight we light\* the central candle, reminding us that Christ is the light of the world, the center of our lives, the shining beacon of hope for all the universe. Christ is born. Praise God! Let us pray.

**All: O Holy God, thank you that the time of waiting and preparing is over and that the light of Christ shines so very clearly tonight. May our joy be full and our hearts rejoice for the world shall never be the same again. Truth and justice and righteousness have come to free all from the bondage of sin. Thank you, God, for this holy night of nights! Amen.**
