

THE MUSIC: On this Epiphany Sunday, welcome our Gospel and Chancel Choirs back to the choir loft, bringing their gifts of song as we commemorate the arrival of the Wise Men in Bethlehem. After his symphonic and chamber music, Mendelssohn is best known for his oratorios, which include *Elijah* and *St. Paul*. His unfinished oratorio *Christus* is the source for today's offertory anthem. Mendelssohn was also the composer of the melody for "Hark! The Herald Angels Sing."

FPCG IS GOING BACK TO PUERTO RICO: FPCG has been traveling to PR for the last two summers to assist in the recovery from Hurricane Maria. We will be heading down there again this summer on July 18-26, 2020. ACT & ENGAGE: Act & Engage is a new initiative that offers the opportunity to wrestle with important issues as followers of Christ: to listen, to learn, to engage through the lens of our Christian faith. Our first topic is Criminal Justice and we have held two programs around it thus far. One that focused on the book "Just Mercy", and a second that looked at Veterans with PTSD. Our January program is a panel discussion with speakers from the legal and prison systems. Join us on Sunday, January 26, 2020 immediately following worship. Please save the date and join us as we strive to discern how God is calling us to respond to this issue.

MCLEAN MEMORIAL ORGAN CENTENNIAL CONCERT SERIES: Philadelphia native Marvin Mills and the Philadelphia Brass will present the next concert in the series on Sunday, January 19, at 4 p.m. Their program of works for organ and brass will commemorate the Martin Luther King Jr. holiday weekend and will include an organ solo by James Lee III, *Ascend the Mountain: A Walk with Dr. King*, which was inspired by King's "I've Been to the Mountaintop" sermon, and selections by Duke Ellington. The concert will be Internet livestreamed for those unable to attend in person.

LOOKING AHEAD: The Germantown Oratorio Choir, with concert pianist Gayle Martin, will present a Beethoven Festival Concert on Sunday, March 15, at 3 p.m. The program will feature the choral music of Beethoven, including the *Choral Fantasy*, in commemoration of the 250th anniversary of the composer's birth.
